Hellrigg Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund — Grant Making

This report illustrates impact the fund has made to support your philanthropic giving through Cumbria Community Foundation. The aim of the Hellrigg Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund is to support charitable or community activities which are environmental or educational, and benefit Silloth or the parishes of Holme St Cuthbert, Holme Low and Holme Abbey.

The Hellrigg Wind Farm Community Benefit Fund awarded four grants totalling £14,036 to the following applicants between April 2020 and March 2021:




CENTRE FOR LEADERSHIP PERFORMANCE

Bright Stars is an eight-week programme designed to introduce children in primary schools across Cumbria to leadership, entrepreneurship and the world of business whilst raising money for charity, winning funds for their school and having fun along the way.

Managed by the Centre for Leadership Performance, it is also delivered in partnership with local businesses. The project involves children learning a range of new skills, from marketing, designing and working with financial budgets, and included the entire school.

Due to COVID-19 lockdown restrictions, the focus in 2021 shifted away from making a profit – to making a difference by creating digital



marking campaigns to champion worthwhile causes chosen by the children.

Now in its ninth year, Bright Stars has engaged over 60 businesses, 100 schools, over 6,000 children, raising over £100,000 for schools and their chosen charities. Business partners and pupils have

forged new links, experienced a huge sense of achievement and developed new skills and confidence along the way.

Funding allowed the project to be expanded into primary schools in the beneficiary area. Holme St Cuthbert's School took part and was partnered with The La'al Collective. The project focussed on raising awareness of environmental issues.

SILLOTH AFC

Silloth Association Football Club is a community sports club that has it's origins in the area from 1885. It has established youth and older teams, however it did not have changing facilities for the women and girls teams.

The grant is contributing to facility improvements, including renovating

the existing building to provide new female changing rooms, a new kitchen area, and a dedicated social space, refurbishing the existing male changing rooms, and installing solar panels to deliver environmental and financial benefits in the long-term.



Colin Baty, Secretary, said: "Our current changing rooms were built in 1982 and have only seen minor improvements since then. We are in desperate need of bringing them up to 21st century standards to also allow for an expanding junior section which has over 100 children training and playing football for Silloth.

"Our project is all about providing equal opportunities for youngsters in the local community – so that girls have access to physical activities, social networks, and role models to boost their confidence, physical health, and mental wellbeing."
