(a) Other Applications or Filings Concerning the Subject Matter of the Proceeding

The Applicant does not have, and is not aware of, any other application or filing that is currently being processed and which concerns the subject matter of this proceeding (i.e., the Cassadaga Wind Project). Specific to federal approvals, the Applicant anticipates that the Facility will ultimately require authorization from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers under Section 404 Clean Water Act (and associated demonstration of compliance with Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act and Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act), and Determinations of No Hazard from the Federal Aviation Administration.

(b) Federal Permits, Consents, Approvals, or Licenses Required for Construction or Operation

Table 33-1 summarizes the anticipated federal permit, consent, approval, or license needed for the proposed Facility, based on the Applicant's current understanding.
